

# Regulations for The Implementation of Chinese Programs for International Students at Da-Yeh University

Amended on January 15, 2019

- Article 1 The *Regulations* are formulated by Da-Yeh University (DYU) as guidelines regarding the implementation of Chinese programs for bachelor international students.
- Article 2 The Chinese Language Center (CLC) at DYU is responsible for the implementation of Chinese language teaching, aiming at improving the four abilities of international students in Chinese listening, speaking, reading and writing, to assist them in pursuit of academic knowledge and adaptation to Taiwanese cultures and campus lives.  
DYU offers two tracks of Chinese programs:
1. Chinese Intensive Program
  2. Chinese Counseling Program
- Article 3 Information regarding Chinese language ability requirements for international students should be announced at the time of student enrollment.
- Article 4 International students at DYU should pass the Chinese Language Proficiency Tests, such as New TOCFL Level 2, HSK Level 4 or any other Chinese language tests equivalent to the CEFR A2 level before enrollment.
- Article 5 International students at DYU who **don't pass** the Chinese Language Proficiency Tests in article 4 should join **Chinese Intensive Programs** which start from the first semester of student's enrollment. The content of the program is based on the general curriculum. The grades are included in the average grade in the semester and shall be used to apply for scholarship in the following semester.
- Article 6 International Students who pass the Chinese Language Proficiency Tests as regulated in article 4 but fail the tests of the CLC at DYU, which shows the students' Chinese daily communication and academic courses are not up to the level, the school may require the students to participate in the Chinese Counseling Programs to assist them in adaptation to campus lives and better academic performance. The grades will not be included in the average grades of the semester and shall not be used to waive other subjects
- Article 7 The Chinese Programs do not charge any additional credit fees. Chinese Intensive Programs is opened when the class attendant is more than one person.
- Article 8 The teaching hours of instructors at the Chinese Intensive Programs are not subject to the extra-hour limit of the hourly fee payment regulations of DYU;

the teaching fees are verified based on the exact number of teaching hours and **are** not subject to the student number requirement.

Article 9 Matters not specified or covered in the Regulations shall be handled in accordance with pertinent regulations of DYU.

Article 10 The Regulations are announced and implemented after being passed by the Academic Committee and officially approved by the President. Amendments to the Regulations should follow the same administrative procedure before implementation.
