

## Da-Yeh University Regulation for International Students Scholarship

Approved at the 130th Administrative Meeting on Mar. 19, 2020

[Applicable to students admitted after academic year 2020 (inclusive)]

**Article 1** It is established in accordance with Article 15 of the Ministry of Education's Regulations Regarding International Students Undertaking Studies in Taiwan.

**Article 2** These regulations refer to International Students in accordance with Articles 2 and 3 of the Ministry of Education's Regulations for International Students Undertaking Studies in Taiwan.

The Hong Kong and Macau Overseas Chinese Students in these regulations refer to the students registered and distributed through the University Entrance Committee For Overseas Chinese Students for undergraduate, master's, and doctoral programs, as well as enrolled students from Hong Kong and Macau. The identity of Overseas Chinese Students is validated by Overseas Community Affairs Council. The identity of Hong Kong and Macau students is validated by the Ministry of Education.

**Article 3** The scholarship award period is four years maximum for the undergraduate program, two years maximum for the master's program, and four years maximum for the doctoral program.

**Article 4** The types and amounts of the scholarship awards are as follows:

1. Entrance Scholarship for Hong Kong and Macau Students

(1) First-Choice Entrance Scholarship

a. Hong Kong and Macau students who apply for the undergraduate entrance scholarship, enrolling through Overseas Community Affairs Council or through an individual admissions of the first stage, with DYU as the First-Choice or all other choices are listed DYU as the target school, and completing the registration, students graduated from DYU's allied schools shall receive an entrance scholarship of NTD 80,000 and it shall be awarded in eight semesters.

b. Starting from the second semester, students' academic score of the previous semester ranked in the top five of the class, and both

of academic score and ethics score are 80 or higher shall be eligible to be awarded the entrance scholarship.

Students who fail to meet the requirement shall not be awarded scholarship. However, students shall receive entrance scholarship in the following semester if requirement is met.

iii. Students who receive this scholarship shall not be awarded other scholarships from the school.

(2) Scholarship for Outstanding DSE Results

a. Students graduated from DYU's allied schools with a DSE score of 12 or higher, and approved by the Overseas Students Scholarship Screening Committee shall be awarded the Level 3 scholarship in the first academic year.

b. Students who receive the above-mentioned entrance scholarship in the academic year shall not be awarded the First-Choice entrance scholarship and other types of entrance scholarship.

2. Entrance scholarship for International Students (excluding Hong Kong and Macau students)

3. Scholarship for current International Students

4. Scholarship shall be awarded in following amounts:

(1) Class 1: The total tuition and miscellaneous fees is waived once a semester, additional NT\$ 40,000 is given to recipient (for the doctoral students only).

(2) Class 2: The total of tuition and miscellaneous fees is waived once a semester.

(3) Class 3: One-half of the total tuition and miscellaneous fees is waived once a semester.

**Article 5** The qualifications for applying this scholarship are as follows:

1. Coming Students

2. Current enrolled International Students

(1) For foreign students, an academic score of the undergraduate level in the previous semester is reached an average score of 80 or higher, an ethics score of 80 or higher; for the students of master's and doctoral program, the average academic score in the previous semester is reached 85 or higher, an ethics score is 80 or higher and with excellent research publications (attaching published dissertation is required).

(2) For Hong Kong and Macau students, an academic score of the undergraduate level in the previous semester is reached an average score of 85 or higher; for the students of master's and doctoral program, the average academic score in the previous semester is reached 85 or higher and an ethics score is 80 or higher and with excellent research publications (attaching published dissertation is required)

**Article 6** The review procedures and awarding of this scholarship are as follows:

1. The Dean of Office of Foreign Affairs serves as the chairperson, the screening committee consists of the Dean of R&D, the Dean of Student Affairs, the Dean Academic Affairs and Accounting Supervisor for overseas scholarship, and it shall review and approve the applications according to the yearly planned budget, the results shall be announced during the mid-term examination week of each semester.

2. Scholarship awarding are divided into semesters and transferred directly to the recipients' account during the mid-term exam week of each semester.

For the Doctoral students, scholarship is awarded at the end of the semester and transferred directly to the recipients' account between June and January of each year.

3. Application period:

(1) Freshmen shall submit an application for this scholarship before the deadline.

(2) Student shall submit all required documents during the first week of each semester according to the Article 7.

**Article 7** Students applying for scholarship shall submit the following documents:

1. Coming International Students:

(1) Application form.

(2) The highest graduation diploma/degree in Chinese or English (stamp or school seal is required).

(3) Certificate of language proficiency in Chinese or English (applicants from non-Chinese or non-English speaking countries).

(4) Study plans and other related documents regarding academic and extracurricular activities.

2. Current enrolled International Students

(1) Undergraduate students:

- a. Application Form.
  - b. Certificate of Enrollment
  - c. The transcript of the previous semester.
  - d. Applicants must complete a 10-hour service learning in the previous semester and shall be certified by the Office of Foreign Affairs.
- (2) Graduate students:
- a. Application form.
  - b. Certificate of enrollment
  - c. The transcript of the previous semester.
  - d. The research findings or the publication of the research collation table and reviewed and sealed by the Research and Development Department.
  - e. Recommendation letter from the advisor.

**Article 8** The Overseas Youth Vocational Training School (OYVTS) students who have finished the study shall apply for admission within three months after the completion of the study. The academic result shall be applied as the standard for awarding scholarship. The top five students in the class shall be awarded the level 2 scholarship and the others are level 3 scholarship.

**Article 9** The Scholarship Committee shall review and evaluate the applications from students who meet the qualifications for entrance scholarship, scholarship shall be awarded to students who have completed registration and course selection in the semester.

**Article 10** International students who apply for this scholarship shall first apply for the Taiwan Scholarship offered by the Taiwan government through the Taiwan overseas mission or representative office in their country of origin (unless the Taiwan Scholarship is not offered in that country). If it is not possible to receive or apply for the Taiwan Scholarship, students may apply for this scholarship if they meet the requirements. International students who have received the Taiwan Scholarship may not apply for this scholarship.

**Article 11** Applicants who receive the scholarship shall be guided by the Office

of Foreign Affairs to conduct a 10-hour service learning. The service learning performance shall be taken into consideration for next application.

**Article 12** For students who meet the criteria for this scholarship but have not completed registration procedures or applied for admission deferral or pre-enrollment leave for the academic year in which they are to receive the scholarship, the scholarship decision shall be revoked. Students who apply for leave following enrollment will not be allowed to continue to receive scholarship from the starting date of the approved leave period. Students returning to school following an approved leave forfeit scholarship eligibility. If scholarship recipients' school performance is poor during the award period, the qualifications for the award shall be cancelled after being signed by the chair of the department or the instructor, and with the consent of the dean of the college, the received award shall be returned to school by the recipients.

**Article 13** Scholarship shall be rescinded for recipients who have been found to have submitted falsified or inaccurate application material. All previously awarded amounts must be returned to school.

**Article 14** These Regulations shall be implemented after being approved at DYU's Administrative Meeting. Later modifications will follow the same procedure.
